Interview Information Summary for Children (Aged 11 and Under)

1) What are we asking you to do?

We are asking you to talk with a researcher about what happened when you went to hospital with a sore arm/leg. Please take time to think about this before deciding. Talking to your parents might help you make up your mind.



2) Why have I been asked to take part?

We are asking you because you recently went to hospital when your arm/leg was sore.

3) Do I have to take part?

No, it's up to you. If you don't want to, that's fine – no one will mind.

4) What do I need to know about the interviews?

The researcher will ask you what you think about how the doctors and nurses looked after you. They will also ask about any x-rays and scans you had done of your arm/leg. We'll use what we find out to help improve how other children are looked after in the future.

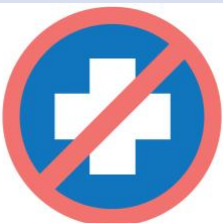
5) What will happen if I take part?

Talking with the researcher will probably take about half an hour. The researcher will ask you if they can record the sound during the interview.

You can decide if you want your mum or dad with you when you talk to the researcher.

If there are any questions you don't want to answer, just tell the researcher and they will move to the next question. You can also stop the interview at any point.

6) What will happen to all the information about me?



Everything you tell us will be kept private. The only time we might need to tell someone is if we were worried about you.

We will write about what we find out. When we do this, we will use a number instead of your name, so no one will be able to tell who you are.
